Bless Park - Back to Nature

Bless Park is being returned to its natural state after the Weston Park Board, Weston Board of Aldermen and Concessionaire Benthe Schwennesen agreed to terminate a contract allowing for a 'Glamping," gardening and event center.

The agreement was signed January 19, just nine months after Ms. Schwennesen signed a 20year contract to build and operate a campground and associated businesses.

Under the termination agreement, the Concessionaire paid \$3,000 in earnest money and incurred \$20,000 in improvements, non-returnable equipment, consumables and other out of pocket expenses it expected to offset over the 20 year business. The parties agreed the Concessionaires will be repaid the half the cost of improvements and all the earnest money, for a total of \$13,000. The Park Board will \$6,500 immediately

"The Weston City Park Board and Bless Park Concessionaire have mutually agreed to terminate the Agreement on operations. The experimental project to develop the park with glamping sites, gardens, education and events proved infeasible. Bless Park will go back to its original state, and the Concessionaire will remove all developments. The Concessionaire wishes to thank the numerous community supporters and hopes that the park will find additional positive uses in future."

Holocaust Remembered Daily In the Netherlands

Dear people of the Weston Chron-

I thought that for International Holocaust Remembrance Day it would be a good idea to share my story on the Holocaust as a foreign Exchange Student. My name is Sieger (CJ) Dantuma, I live in the Netherlands and I'm here through the International Student Exchange

On the 27th of January we commemorate the victims of the Holocaust on The International Holocaust Remembrance Day.

As a foreign exchange student the impact the Holocaust has had on my country differs greatly from the US. In my home country, the Netherlands, you hear and see traces of the Holocaust everywhere.

Back in 2017 I had the honor to lay what we call in Dutch a "Struikelsteen", which translates to stumbling stone. These stumbling stones indicate the houses where war victims, mostly Jewish, lived before they were forced out of their homes. They are laid on the sidewalk right in front of the houses.

The stones are concrete with a brass plate in which the name, birthdate, date and cause of death is mentioned. This way we commemorate the war victims in our communities who lost

their lives during World War 2.

Every time you walk on the out of their house by Nazi soldiers. sidewalk you might stumble across way of remembering the innocent victims of war. An applicable quote is "A person is only forgotten when their name is forgotten".

With these stones the victims of systematic eradication will always be remembered. Currently there are stolpersteine in 26 European countries. Stolpersteine, or stumbling stones have gotten their name from the fact that you 'stumble' over them with your head and your heart.

Growing up I was raised with born during the war. One made the biggest impact on me. It was of my grandfather's sister named Marjo. September 1942 a peaceful Jewish

family in her neighborhood was taken

She remembered how she heard one of these stones, which is our Doortje, the family's youngest daughter, passing by her house on her boots. Doortje and her family were first brought to Westerbork in the Netherlands and then to Auschwitz where they passed away.

The 18th of January I was invited to join First Baptist Church in Weston to discuss the book: "The Hiding Place" by Corrie Ten Boom. Corrie Ten Boom was part of the resistance movement in Holland, and she hid and helped multiple Jews.

Reading this book was stories of grandparents who were extraordinary, especially to read about the Resistance but also forgiveness which played a big role in the book.
